LIVING THE "SUITE" LIFE SOPHOMORE YEAR

By sophomore year you'll be ready for a lifestyle that offers more independence. You may choose Plymouth Complex, circular-shaped halls where you and three other students share a suite consisting of a full bath and two double occupancy rooms that open to a central courtyard.

Another great choice is the LaRiviere Center, our living and learning facility, which accommodates six or eight students in a suite with bedrooms, two bathrooms, and a living room. The LaRiviere Center also features a computer lab, multipurpose recreational and meeting space, study rooms, and classrooms. You'll be given priority consideration for assignment by forming theme communities based on similar academic interests or other topics.

A third option is Commonwealth Hall. Its corridor style living also features multipurpose recreational and meeting rooms. As space permits, sophomores may also live in Gateway Village with apartments designed for two to six students.
