- \* The following Springfield Technical Community College courses will count towards satisfying Western New England University's general University requirements, referred to as Perspectives of Understanding: Any three credit art, film, music or theatre course (one); any history course (one); any economics or political science course or PSY-101 General Psychology or SOC 101 Intro. to Sociology (one); PHL 101Philosophy 1 or PHL 102 Philosophy 2.
- \*\* Students should take MATH 115 Statistics as one of their math electives. The other math elective course will transfer in as a general elective.
- \*\*\* It is strongly recommended students take CIT 131 Unix 2, however to allow for greater flexibility in the program students should consider taking CIT 201/201L Database Systems as well. It is recommended students take CIT 101, CIT 115/L and CIT 117/L to stay on sequence with the WNE IT program, and to earn credit for CSIT 101, CSIT 102 and a general elective.
