Please reference our College Catalogue for additional information. A maximum of 70 semester hours may be transferred from two-year institutions.

\* The following Quinsigamond Community College courses will count towards satisfying Western New England University general education requirements: Any history course (one), PSY 101 Introduction to Psychology **or** SO 101 Introduction to Sociology, SPH 101 Speech Communication Skills.

Business courses from a college not accredited by AACSB that are determined to be equivalent to 300-400 level courses at Western New England University will be considered for transfer credit (up to two courses).

\*\*The following business electives offered at Quinsigamond Community College will satisfy a specific business requirement at Western New England : MRK 201 Principles of Marketing, BSL 101 Business Law I, FIN 250 Principles of Finance.

Students must receive a grade of a 'B-' or better in their English coursework to receive transfer credit.
